

Andes Mountains

- The Andes Mountains are located in South America and run north to south along the western coast of the continent.
- * They stretch over 5,500 miles long.
- * The Andes is the world's longest mountain chain.










Highlands

- * Guiana Highlands: Plateau and lowmountain region in South America.
- * **Brazilian Highlands:** Low mountains, hilly uplands, and plateaus. The highlands rise to an average elevation of 3,300 feet.
- Patagonia: Located in Argentina and Chile. This area is desert or semi-desert and receives very little rainfall.



Plains

- * There are 3 major plains regions in South America: the Llanos plains, the Gran Chaco, and the Pampas.
- * Llanos: Located in western Venezuela and northeastern Colombia. The Llanos occupy more than 220,000 sq. miles.
- * **Gran Chaco:** Located in parts of Argentina, Paraguay, and Bolivia.
- The Pampas: Located in central Argentina, most of Uruguay, and southern Brazil. They are flat or softly rolling plains covered mostly with grasses.



Amazon Rainforest

* The Amazon occupies more than 40% of Brazil's area.

- * The rainforest is divided into four layers: emergent (tallest trees), canopy (very thick trees that keep over 80% of the sunlight out), understory (receives very little sunlight), and the forest floor (insects and small animals live here).
- * The Amazon covers 1/3 of the continent.
- * There are over 40,000 different kinds of plants and more than 30 million species of insects.
- * Over 20% of the Amazon has been destroyed.











Atacama Desert

* It stretches more than 600 miles through northern Chile.

* It is different from most deserts because the average temperature is only about 65°F but it receives very little rain.







Volcanoes

- * Central America is known for its volcanoes that are along the Pacific coast.
- * The volcanoes are located along the <u>ring of fire</u>.
 - * The ring of fire is an area of volcanoes encircling the Pacific Ocean.
- * Many of the volcanoes are dormant but many are still active.
- * Most of the volcanoes are located in Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Nicaragua. Belize has none and Panama has 1, and Honduras has 4 that are inactive.
